
## TRIUMPH OF DEATH

In the book's prologue is at Yankee Stadium in 1951 for the game with the "shot heard around the world" J. Edgar Hoover finds The Triumph of Death reprinted in the thrown-out pages of a Life magazine. The Bruegel work is a panorama of slaughter in an apocalyptic landscape, and it's echoed throughout the book-in the nuclear hellscape evoked by Eisenstein in a (DeLilloinvented) movie called *Underwelt*, in the horrible and possibly apocryphal fates of atom-bomb downwinders, in the "Museum of the Misshapen" in Kazakhstan.

#### JEAN LECOMTE DU NOUŸ A EUNUCH'S DREAM1874



This painting, inspired by **Charles Montesquieu's** Persian Letters (published in 1721), depicts a eunuch who wanted to marry a harem slave. He experienced a vision of her while smoking his opium pipe, but her little companion holding a knife dripping with blood reminds us that the eunuch's anatomy precludes the fulfillment of his dream. The outline of a hand next to the signature is a khamsa, a symbol used to ward off evil.
